SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

In his farewell discourses to the disciples, Jesus stressed the importance of his “return to the Father”, the culmination of his whole mission: indeed, he came into the world to bring man back to God, not on the ideal level – like a philosopher or a master of wisdom – but really, like a shepherd who wants to lead his sheep back to the fold. It was for our sake that he came down from Heaven and for our sake that he ascended to it, after making himself in all things like men, humbling himself even to death on a cross and after having touched the abyss of the greatest distance from God. For this very reason the Father was pleased with him and “highly exalted” him (*Philippians 2:9*), restoring to him the fullness of his glory, but now with our humanity. God in man – man in God: this is even now a reality, not a theoretical truth.

CARDINAL’S STEWARDSHIP APPEAL

The *Cardinal’s Annual Stewardship Appeal* is responsible for many, many charitable, educational and pastoral activities throughout our very large archdiocesan family. We would like to close out this year’s appeal here as quickly as possible. Unfortunately, unlike last year when we were over goal at this point, this year we are still waiting for some significant gifts which haven’t materialized. Presently, we are at 79% of our goal—\$16,000 short of success. Because we went over goal last year, we received a rebate of \$9,000. If you have not made your sacrificial gift this year, please use one of the envelopes in the pews immediately. Our parish benefits all year from the Appeal. We need to do our part to make sure that this continues. When the MTA announced its plan to install a ventilation plant in front of our church, we sought the counsel of the Legal Affairs Department at the Archdiocese, who immediately put us in touch with an outstanding New York law firm, which represented us at various meetings of the MTA. BLACK AND INDIAN MISSION COLLECTION

The annual *Black and Indian Mission Collection*, next Sunday’s second collection, enables the Church in the United States to provide desperately required pastoral, educational, and spiritual assistance to some of the neediest of our brothers and sisters in the Lord. From the inner cities of the rural south to the deserts of the southwest to the wilderness of Alaska, grants from the annual appeal make it possible for the Church to assist our Black and Indian Catholic communities. Here in the Archdiocese of New York, we receive grants twice per year that are applied to black parishes in Harlem and the Bronx, making it possible for them to serve their parishioners much more than they could on their own.
